This is an enterprise PMO so the projects will span very technical/IT in nature to very business-centric.

The Project Manager will need to have the ability to create project charters and project plans, drive stakeholder management (internal and external), assess risks, and drive projects to completion. **Standard duties are below... What you'll do:**

Ensure that all projects are delivered on-time, within scope and within budget

Develop project scopes and objectives, involving all relevant stakeholders and ensuring technical feasibility

Identify and manage project risks and issues, and implement effective mitigation strategies to ensure successful project delivery

Coordinate and collaborate with cross-functional teams, including IT development, infrastructure, operations, and business units, to ensure alignment and integration of project activities

Report project outcomes and/or risks to the appropriate management channels and escalate issues, as necessary, according to project work plan

Ensure resource availability and allocation (if required for project size)

Develop a detailed project plan to track progress

Leverage standardized procedures to manage changes in project scope, schedule and costs

Measure project performance using appropriate systems, tools and techniques

Additional Skills & Qualifications

PMP is not required, but a plus. Ideally, the PM would have experience with IT and business-centric projects.
